Materials List for “LET LOOSE! ABSTRACTS IN ACRYLIC”

First, please feel free to bring whatever supplies that you have ... this class is intended to be a fun stretch into the many ways to let loose and create abstract art - an exploration! Any supplies and tools that you enjoy working with are welcome!

- Acrylic paints (black, titanium white and a minimum of the primary colours - Yellow, Blue, Red + whatever colours you are drawn too and can happily afford.
- Brushes - bristle or synthetic brushes meant for oil/acrylic Deserres carries a brand called Zen which are nice and not overly expensive. I like to use Flat bristle brushes - sizes 4, 6 and 8 (optional would be a 2 or a 10)
- Heavy paper - 140lb mixed media 11 x15” or 9 x 12
- Canvases - (squares are my favourite) and either stretch canvas or canvas boards (both are fine) Sizes such as 6 x 6, 8 x 8, 10 x 10, 12 x 12, or 14 x 14 also rectangle canvases are just fine as well 10 x 12, 11 x 14, 12 x 16
- Notebook/sketchbook (any size) + pencil /,eraser
- Tape: for taping off borders on paper
- Additional Optional tools: Palette knife if you have one, I also use sticks, old plastic membership cards, charcoal, pencil, paint pens (thin white, gold), black thin line pen

For first class we will be working on paper, and then small canvas or wood. 3 or 4 small 6 x 6, 8 x 8, canvas or wood blocks for a series of small pieces. If you prefer you can continue to use heavy paper.



Workspace Supplies

- disposable palette sheet to mix your paints on or parchment paper
- paper towels or old rags
- a plastic container for water
- table cover for OAS studio tables (you can get plastic table cloths from the dollar store)
- apron

- rubber gloves (optional, if you wish to paint with them on)
- table top easel for ease of painting (optional)

Tips

I find a box in the back of your car that fits your canvas sizes is handy for getting a wet painting home.

And sometimes I just wrap my brushes in a rag, put them in a bag and clean them with soap and water when I get home. Just shake and leave them to dry.
