

## **Diane McEntee - Materials List for A Beginner's Guide to Watercolour**

- 140 lb cold press watercolour paper.  
May use sheets or a book with paper in pressed pads (minimum 10 X 12 but 12 X 16 is better).  
Watercolour paper will be provided for the first classes. Students are welcome to share.
- Three primary paints in tubes or pans. Try to buy artist quality.
  - Aureolin Yellow
  - Crimson
  - Ultramarine Blue

Don't worry if you can't find these colours. Any three primaries will do.

- A palette if you have one; if you don't, you can use an old saucer to put your paints, or even a piece of waxed paper.
- Round brushes Size 10 and 2  
I recommend two to start plus a standard Dollar Store paintbrush to put a wash on the paper.
- Pencil
- Eraser
- A container for water – old margarine tub, etc.
- Table cover- A white/clear plastic one from the dollar store is good
