

## Diane McEntee - Materials List for A Beginner's Guide to Watercolour

- 140 lb cold press watercolour paper. May use sheets or a book with paper in pressed pads (minimum 9 X 12 but 12 X 16 is better). Canson is not good paper.

- Paints in tubes or pans. Try to buy artist quality, not student quality. My suggestion:

Lemon Yellow, Bismuth, or Aureolin Yellow

Crimson, Scarlet or Ruby Red

Ultramarine Blue or cobalt blue

Raw Umber or burnt umber

Bring any colours you already have

- A palette if you have one; if you don't, you can use an old saucer.

- Round watercolour brushes, sizes 10 and 2. I recommend two to start. We will not use flat brushes.

- Pencil

- Eraser

- Container for water – old margarine tub, etc. (a cup is too small)

- Table cover- A white/clear plastic one from the dollar store is good

- Box of tissues

Masking tape
